This MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU) is hereby made and entered into by and between the U.S. Department of Interior, Bureau of Land Management, Lakeview District and Northern California District, and the U.S. Department of Interior, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, Sheldon-Hart National Wildlife Refuge Complex and Klamath Basin National Wildlife Refuge Complex, and the U.S. Department of Interior, National Park Service, Lave Beds National Monument, hereinafter referred to as "the Cooperators," and the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA), Forest Service, Modoc National Forest and Fremont-Winema National Forest, hereinafter referred to as the "U.S. Forest Service."

Background: This agreement replaces 11-MU-11060200-041

Title: Cal-OR Task Force

I. PURPOSE: The purpose of this MOU is to document the cooperation between the parties to coordinate and organize using their own resources a Task Force/Strike Team of professional resources for immediate need and extended attack in accordance with the following provisions.

II. STATEMENT OF MUTUAL BENEFIT AND INTERESTS:

All agencies share a common interest to increase the number of qualified Task/Force Strike leaders by providing increased training opportunities on wildfire assignments. Emerging wildfire incidents can benefit from having a pre-organized Task Force/

Strike Team available for dispatch in a timely manner to initial attack incidents. All parties are involved in minimizing the time necessary to gather and mobilize resources for emerging wildland fire incidents. All agencies benefit in similar manner by combining several individual resources into a single resource with pre-identified leadership and common communications for use on wildfire incidents.

In consideration of the above premises, the parties agree as follows:

III.COOPERATORS SHALL:

- A. Assign the resources to the Task Force based on their internal agency procedures.
- B. Agree to a Task Force/Strike Team configuration and dispatch procedure of resources as shown in Exhibit A, or as modified and agreed upon by all parties
- C. Meet annually to review, edit and update the Task Force/Strike Team configuration and dispatch protocols and identify any changes through a written modification.

IV. THE U.S. FOREST SERVICE SHALL:

A. Meet the same actions as written above for the cooperators.

V. IT IS MUTUALLY UNDERSTOOD AND AGREED BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES THAT:

- A. <u>RESPONSIBILITES OF THE COOPERATORS</u>: The U.S. Department of Agriculture and the Department of Interior and their respective agencies and offices will handle their own activities and utilize the own resources, including the expenditure of their own funds, in pursuing these objectives, Each cooperator will carry out its separate activities in a coordinated and mutually beneficial manner.
- B. <u>ESTABLISHMENT OF RESPONSIBILITY</u>: This MOU is not intended to, and does not create any right, benefit, or trust responsibility, substantive or procedural, enforceable at law or equity, by a party against the United States, its agencies, or any person.
- C. <u>PRINCIPAL CONTACTS</u>: Individuals listed below are authorized to act in their respective areas for matters related to this agreement.

D. <u>ASSURANCE REGARDING FELONY CONVICTION OR TAX</u>
<u>DELINQUENT STATUS FOR CORPORATE ENTITIES</u>. This agreement is subject to the provisions contained in the Department of Interior, Environment, and Related Agencies Appropriations Act, 2012, P.L. No. 112-74, Division E,



Section 433 and 434 regarding corporate felony convictions and corporate federal tax delinquencies. Accordingly, by entering into this agreement Cooperators acknowledges that it: 1) does not have a tax delinquency, meaning that it is not subject to any unpaid Federal tax liability that has been assessed, for which all judicial and administrative remedies have been exhausted or have lapsed, and that is not being paid in a timely manner pursuant to an agreement with the authority responsible for collecting the tax liability, and (2) has not been convicted (or had an officer or agent acting on its behalf convicted) of a felony criminal violation under any Federal law within 24 months preceding the agreement, unless a suspending and debarring official of the USDA has considered suspension or debarment is not necessary to protect the interests of the Government. If Cooperators fails to comply with these provisions, the U.S. Forest Service will annul this agreement and may recover any funds Cooperators has expended in violation of sections 433 and 434.

E. <u>NOTICES</u>. Any communications affecting the operations covered by this agreement given by the U.S. Forest Service or Cooperators is sufficient only if in writing and delivered in person, mailed, or transmitted electronically by e-mail or fax, as follows:

To the U.S. Forest Service Program Manager, at the address specified in the MOU.

To Cooperators listed Program Contact, at the Cooperators Program Contract's address shown in the MOU or such other address designated within the MOU.

Notices are effective when delivered in accordance with this provision, or on the effective date of the notice, whichever is later.

- F. <u>PARTICIPATION IN SIMILAR ACTIVITIES</u>. This MOU in no way restricts the U.S. Forest Service or Cooperators from participating in similar activities with other public or private agencies, organizations, and individuals.
- G. <u>ENDORSEMENT</u>. Any of Cooperators' contributions made under this MOU do not by direct reference or implication convey U.S. Forest Service endorsement of Cooperators's products or activities.
- H. <u>NONBINDING AGREEMENT</u>. This MOU creates no right, benefit, or trust responsibility, substantive or procedural, enforceable by law or equity. The parties shall manage their respective resources and activities in a separate, coordinated and mutually beneficial manner to meet the purpose(s) of this MOU. Nothing in this MOU authorizes any of the parties to obligate or transfer anything of value.



Specific, prospective projects or activities that involve the transfer of funds, services, property, and/or anything of value to a party requires the execution of separate agreements and are contingent upon numerous factors, including, as applicable, but not limited to: agency availability of appropriated funds and other resources; cooperator availability of funds and other resources; agency and cooperator administrative and legal requirements (including agency authorization by statute); etc. This MOU neither provides, nor meets these criteria. If the parties elect to enter into an obligation agreement that involves the transfer of funds, services, property, and/or anything of value to a party, then the applicable criteria must be met. Additionally, under a prospective agreement, each party operates under its own laws, regulations, and/or policies, and any Forest Service obligation is subject to the availability of appropriated funds and other resources. The negotiation, execution, and administration of these prospective agreements must comply with all applicable law.

Nothing in this MOU is intended to alter, limit, or expand the agencies' statutory and regulatory authority.

- I. <u>USE OF U.S. FOREST SERVICE INSIGNIA</u>. In order for Cooperators to use the U.S. Forest Service insignia on any published media, such as a Web page, printed publication, or audiovisual production, permission must be granted from the U.S. Forest Service's Office of Communications. A written request must be submitted and approval granted in writing by the Office of Communications (Washington Office) prior to use of the insignia.
- J. <u>MEMBERS OF U.S. CONGRESS</u>. Pursuant to 41 U.S.C. 22, no U.S. member of, or U.S. delegate to, Congress shall be admitted to any share or part of this agreement, or benefits that may arise therefrom, either directly or indirectly.
- K. <u>FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT (FOIA)</u>. Public access to MOU or agreement records must not be limited, except when such records must be kept confidential and would have been exempted from disclosure pursuant to Freedom of Information regulations (5 U.S.C. 552).
- L. <u>TEXT MESSAGING WHILE DRIVING</u>. In accordance with Executive Order (EO) 13513, "Federal Leadership on Reducing Text Messaging While Driving," any and all text messaging by Federal employees is banned: a) while driving a Government owned vehicle (GOV) or driving a privately owned vehicle (POV) while on official Government business; or b) using any electronic equipment supplied by the Government when driving any vehicle at any time. All cooperators, their employees, volunteers, and contractors are encouraged to adopt and enforce policies that ban text messaging when driving company owned, leased or rented vehicles, POVs or GOVs when driving while on official Government business or when performing any work for or on behalf of the Government.



- M. <u>U.S. FOREST SERVICE ACKNOWLEDGED IN PUBLICATIONS</u>, <u>AUDIOVISUALS AND ELECTRONIC MEDIA</u>. Cooperators shall acknowledge U.S. Forest Service support in any publications, audiovisuals, and electronic media developed as a result of this MOU.
- N. <u>NONDISCRIMINATION STATEMENT PRINTED, ELECTRONIC, OR AUDIOVISUAL MATERIAL</u>. Cooperators shall include the following statement, in full, in any printed, audiovisual material, or electronic media for public distribution developed or printed with any Federal funding.

In accordance with Federal law and U.S. Department of Agriculture policy, this institution is prohibited from discriminating on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, age, or disability. (Not all prohibited bases apply to all programs.)

- O. <u>TERMINATION</u>. Any of the parties, in writing, may terminate this MOU in whole, or in part, at any time before the date of expiration.
- P. <u>MODIFICATIONS</u>. Modifications within the scope of this MOU must be made by mutual consent of the parties, by the issuance of a written modification signed and dated by all properly authorized, signatory officials, prior to any changes being performed. Requests for modification should be made, in writing, at least 30 days prior to implementation of the requested change.
- Q. <u>COMMENCEMENT/EXPIRATION DATE</u>. This MOU is executed as of the date of the last signature and is effective through April 30, 2021 at which time it will expire.
- R. <u>AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVES</u>. By signature below, each party certifies that the individuals listed in this document as representatives of the individual parties are authorized to act in their respective areas for matters related to this MOU.

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EXHIBIT A

TASK FORCE/STRIKE TEAM CONFIGURATION

The task force configuration will consist of a combination of 5 individual resources and a qualified Task Force leader (TFLD and TFLD trainee). The strike team configuration will consist of 5 like type engines along with a qualified Strike team leader and trainee (STEN and STEN trainee). The resources could go up to 5 engines types 3 through 6, an agency tactical water tender or water tender, a type 1 Interagency Hotshot Crew (IHC) or type 2 IA crew and an type 2 or 3 dozer. The TFLD/STEN and TFLD/STEN trainee are single resources and will not be assigned to an engine or crew making up the task force/strike team.

PROCEDURE

The Modoc Interagency Command Center (MICC) is the host dispatch center and will coordinate with the Lakeview Interagency Fire Center (LIFC) and Susanville Interagency Fire Center (SIFC) to determine the availability of the task force/strike team and its' configuration.

LIFC will report resources availability via radio link to MICC at 1000. MICC. MICC will advise LIFC, SIFC and Northern California Coordination Center (NOPS) of the Task Force/strike team status.

LIFC will then status the Task Force/strike team with the Northwest Coordination Center (NWCC) MICC will coordinate with Susanville Interagency Fire Center their resource availability.

Each dispatch center will determine the resource(s) to assign based on their internal procedures. The TFLD/STEN leaders for each assignment will be determined by rotation between the three dispatch centers. It has been agreed that, when possible, the TFLD/STEN will come from the Region that is requesting the Task Force/strike team. When the request is from a Geographic Area Coordination Center (GACC) other than the North Ops or Northwest GACC's, the TFLD/STEN assigned will be determined by a rotation list the unit duty officer will provide prior to fire season each year. The units will develop a priority list of trainees for the Task Force/strike team prior to fire season each year.

The Task Force/strike team will not take priority over filling requested for single resources. When single resources orders are filled making the Task Force/strike team unavailable, MICC, SIFC and LIFC will notify their respective Coordination Centers.
