

ORDER NO. 06-02-24-02

TEMPORARY PUBLIC USE RESTRICTIONS FREMONT - WINEMA NATIONAL FOREST

Pursuant to 16 U.S.C. § 551, 36 C.F.R. § 261.50(a) and (b), the following prohibitions apply to all lands within the Fremont-Winema National Forest. This Order becomes effective on July 11, 2024, and will remain in effect through September 30, 2024, unless rescinded sooner. This Order supersedes Order # 06-02-24-01 which was issued on June 27, 2024.

PROHIBITIONS:

- 1. Building, maintaining, attending or using a fire, campfire, or stove fire, including a charcoal fire. **36 CFR § 261.52(a)**
- 2. Using an explosive. 36 CFR § 261.52(b)
- 3. Smoking, except within an enclosed vehicle or building, a designated campground, or while stopped in an area at least three feet in diameter that is barren or cleared of all flammable material. **36 CFR § 261.52(d)**
- 4. Possessing, discharging or using any kind of firework or other pyrotechnic device. **36 CFR § 261.52(f)**
- Operating a chainsaw or other equipment powered by an internal combustion engine.
 36 CFR § 261.52(h)
- 6. Welding, or operating an acetylene or other torch with open flame. 36 CFR § 261.52(i)
- 7. Operating or using any internal or external combustion engine without a spark arresting device that is properly installed, maintained, and in effective working order in accordance with U.S. Forest Service Standard 5100-1. **36 CFR § 261.52(j)**
- 8. Violating any state law concerning burning, fires, or which is for the purpose of preventing or restricting the spread of fire. **36 CFR § 261.52(k)**
- Possessing or using a motor vehicle off National Forest System Roads. 36 CFR §261.56



EXEMPTIONS:

Pursuant to 36 CFR § 261.50(e), the following are exempt from this Order:

- (1) Persons with Forest Service Permit No. FS-7700-48 (Permit for Use of Roads, Trails, or Areas Restricted by Regulation or Order), specifically exempting them from this Order.
- (2) Any Federal, State, or Local Officer or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.
- (3) Petroleum-fueled stoves, lanterns or heating devices, provided such devices meet the fire underwriter's specifications for safety.

These prohibitions are in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart A.

Violations of this prohibition are punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than 6 months, or both (16 USC § 551; 18 USC § 3551, 3571, and 3581)
